Graveside services and interment for Virginia Grace Barrett, 95, were held Aug. 6 at the Wheatland Cemetery with Reverend Les Ludlam of the United Methodist officiating.

Mrs. Barrett died Aug. 3 at the Platte County Memorial Nursing Home in Wheatland.

She was born March 26, 1907 in Christiansburg, VA, the daughter of Percy J. and Lucy Lee (Walton) Booth. Her father died in 1918 and her mother moved Virginia and her two sisters to Wyoming in 1920. They attended Wheatland schools, and later moved to Greeley, Colo. She met and married Harry H. Eaton in 1926. Due to Harry's health, they moved to Wheatland. Harry worked as a cowboy and Virginia as a cook for the King Brothers ranch, west of Wheatland. Harry died in 1932, and Virginia continued to work as a cook and housekeeper.

In the 1940's she worked at the Buechner Drug as a clerk. On April 22, 1946 she married Hubert Barrett, and they farmed and ranched until his death in 1981.

Virginia then moved to town. In 1995 she became a resident of Platte County Memorial Nurs-

ing Home and resided there until her death.

She was a member of the United Methodist Church.

Virginia enjoyed all of nature, her family, friends and children. She liked to cook, work in her yard and garden, rock hunting and traveling to the mountains. She was blessed with a great sense of humor, kindness and compassion for all.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her husbands; her sister, Koreen Jones; and her dear brother-in-law Wallace Holben.

She is survived by her sister, Mildred Holben of Cheyenne; daughter Bette Adams of Sheridan; five grand children, Mike Campbell of Buffalo, Wyo., C.K. McCain of Henderson, Nev., Dixie McReynolds and husband Tom of Casper, Judy Robinson of Las Vegas, Nev., and Monte Worthington of Gillette; nine great-grandchildren; three great-great grandchildren; and her special friend Judy Hurlburt of Wheatland.
