

BOYD, RICHARD KEITH
October 17, 1918-October 7, 1961

A well-known former Wheatland man, Keith Boyd, 42, died suddenly, the victim of a heart attack, last Saturday afternoon, Oct. 7, while attending the Wyoming Utah State football game in Laramie.

He was the brother of Lt. Neil Boyd, Highway Patrol. The deceased was attending the game with his wife Harriet, and the Neil Boyds when he was stricken.

Born in Wheatland, Oct. 17, 1918, Boyd was the son of the late Esther Freeman Williams and the late Clifford Boyd. He graduated from the Wheatland high school with the class of 1937.

Mr. Boyd was employed by the City of Denver as a civil engineer, and had lived in Denver since 1946. He was a member of the Congregational church, a Mason, and was a veteran of World War II.

Funeral services were conducted from the Congregational church in Wheatland Wednesday of this week at 2 p.m. with the Rev. John McConnell of Laramie officiating. Burial was in the Wheatland cemetery.

Pallbearers were Lee Peterson of Douglas, Robert Fedell of Denver, Willis Pike of Casper, and Ray Lutterman, Harold Garrett and Dick Dockter, all of Wheatland.

Immediate survivors include his wife, Harriet, and his brother Neil of Laramie. There are also several aunts and cousins living in the Wheatland area.
