**Mrs. Foley Calhoun Mother of 4 Little Ones Dies Saturday
Death Follows Illness Of Two Years' Duration**

Four little children were made motherless, Saturday when their mother Mrs. Foley Calhoun, passed away at the St. Joseph hospital in Denver.

Mrs. Calhoun had been in poor health for the past two years and was taken a short time ago to Denver for an operation. She seemingly was getting better and on the day of her death, wrote four letters to her family. Death came very suddenly and resulted from a weak heart. Her body was returned to Wheatland by H.G. Watson, of the Watson Mortuary, and funeral services were held from the Mortuary chapel Tuesday morning with Rev. R.E. Morgan of the Congregational church performing the last rites. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery.

Lula Adams was born at Lake Andes, S.D., in 1900 and came to Wheatland with her parents in 1906. She is survived by her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Walt Adams, her husband, four children, Vincent, Nettie, Floyd and Dale, one sister, Mrs. Henry Irvine and one brother, Earl Adams, all of Wheatland.

MRS. CALHOUN DIES IN DENVER

Mrs. Lulu Calhoun, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Walt Adams, of Wheatland, died in Saint Joseph's hospital in Denver, on Saturday after a week in the hospital, though she had been in poor health for the past two years. She is survived by her husband and four children, one child having preceded her in death, her parents and sisters and brothers. Mrs. Calhoun was in her early thirties and her death is a sad blow to her relatives and friends.

Funeral services were held from the Watson Mortuary in Wheatland at nine o'clock on Tuesday morning, with Rev. R.E. Morgan in charge of the services. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery.
