

GRISWOLD, IDA A.
August 8, 1875-October 14, 1956

Miss Ida A. Griswold, a former resident of Cheyenne and a sister of Mrs. James Chaplin of Wheatland, died Sunday morning in Denver where she had spent the past month. Both Mr. and Mrs. Chaplin were with Miss Griswold at the time.

She was born in Chicago August 8, 1875 and came to Cheyenne in 1910. She was employed in the business office of the Wyoming State Tribune for several years. For the past 17 years she had made her home in Pasadena, Calif., but came to Wheatland the past summer to visit Mr. and Mrs. Chaplin.

Miss Griswold was a member of the First Church of Christ, Scientist in Pasadena, and the mother church of Christian Science in Boston, Mass.

Surviving are her sister, Mrs. Chaplin; three brothers, Leonard A. Long of Chicago, Raymond O. Long of Blue Island, Ill. and Eldredge R. Long of Tujunga, Calif.

Funeral services were held Wednesday at 2 p.m. in the Schrader mortuary in Wheatland and burial was in the local cemetery.
