**Carl Judge Dies Monday Afternoon**

Carl Judge, well-known Wheatland resident, died late Monday afternoon at the Wheatland hospital of a heart ailment.

Mr. Judge had been confined to his home most of the time in recent weeks by complications which aggravated a heart ailment. When his condition became worse Monday morning he was removed to the hospital for closer observation.

He was at one time owner of the Iris Theatre, now the Ramona.

Surviving are his wife, one daughter, Mrs. Bob Straw, and 3 sons, Herbie and William of Casper and Blair of Laramie.

**Carl Judge Dies Of Heart Attack Monday Afternoon**

Carl Judge, 60, passed away at Wheatland Monday afternoon, April 17. Mr. Judge had been ill many months with a heart ailment, but his condition did not become critical until the past week.

Mr. Judge was born July 10, 1878 at Osage City, Kansas and moved to Oklahoma with his family at the age of twelve where he received his education in the schools and colleges of Stillwater. Mr. Judge chose journalism as his profession and at one time published three newspaper out of Salina, Kansas and served for a time as foreman on a daily newspaper.

In 1904 he was married to Lenora Woolsey at El Reno, Oklahoma and to this union four children were born. In 1923, the Judge family moved to Wheatland where he bought the Iris Theatre and operated it for ten years. He also established the free paper known as "The Town Cryer."

Surviving are his widow, one daughter, Mrs. Bob Straw of Wheatland, three sons, Oren and Herbert of Casper and Blair of Laramie, one brother, William of Perkins, Oklahoma, two grandchildren and a host of other relatives and friends.

Funeral services were held this afternoon (Thursday) at the Christian church at 2:00 with Rev. J.R. Campbell officiating. Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery with Watson and Dennis in charge of arrangements.

## **OBITUARY**

Carl Judge was born July 10, 1878 at Osage City, Kansas and died April 7, 1939 at Wheatland, Wyoming, being 60 years, 9 months and 7 days at the time of his death.

He moved to Oklahoma at the age of twelve with his family, and received his education in schools and colleges of Stillwater, Oklahoma and for two years thereafter read law in Oklahoma City, then decided to take up journalism. This profession he followed for 25 years. At one time he published 3 newspapers out of Salina, Kansas and for some time was foreman on a daily.

He enlisted for service during the world war but the armistice was signed shortly after his call.

He was married to Lenora Woolsey at El Reno, Oklahoma in 1904. To this union were born four children.

They moved from Jewell county, Kansas to Wheatland, Wyoming in 1923 when he bought the Iris Theatre which he operated for ten years. He also established the little free paper known as "The Town Cryer."

He is survived by his wife, a daughter, Mrs. Robert Straw, three sons, Oren and Herbert Judge of Casper and Blair Judge of Laramie and two grandchildren. His brother William of Perkins, Oklahoma, also survives him. Besides brothers and sisters-in-law, daughters-in-law and one son-in-law and a host of friends.

He was a sincere Christian, a loyal friend and truly lived by the Golden Rule.
