

MADDOX, MARY O. IVEY
August 27, 1877-September 30, 1965

Mary O. Maddox, former Wheatland resident, succumbed in a North Sacramento hospital on Sept. 30, 1965 following a brief illness. Mrs. Maddox was born in Chestnut, Ill. on Aug. 27, 1877. She lived in Iowa and Nebraska before moving to Wheatland with her husband Ed Maddox and five children in March 1919.

Mrs. Maddox and her daughter Nina operated a Laundry and Dry Cleaning business in Wheatland for a number of years before moving to Jackson, Wyo. in 1938.

She was a member of the Rebekah Lodge for 42 years, was a past Noble Grand, and held an office in the Grand Rebekah Assembly.

Survivors include three daughters, Eva McDougall and Nina Maddox, both of 639 Arcade Blvd., No. Sacramento, Calif., and Blanche Porter, 650 8th St., Elko, Nev; a brother, Floyd Ivey of Council Bluffs, Ia.; sister, Clara Laughery, Pacific Row, Calif.; seven grandchildren and twenty great grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband, a son Vernon, and a daughter Opal.

Funeral services were held at No. Sacramento Funeral Chapel on Sept. 4, following by private cremation services conducted by Rev. Paul Irwin. Final interment of the ashes will be held at the family plot in the Wheatland cemetery on Sept. 24. Her granddaughter, Donna M. Deiger of Sidney, Nebr. will be the only member of the family attending the graveside rites.
