A funeral service for Terry Lee Eddleman, 59, will be conducted at 10:00 A.M., Thursday, June 24, 2010, at the Wheatland Bible Church, Highway 312 and Palmer Canyon Road in Wheatland, Wyoming, with Pastor Denzil G. Mauk officiating. Interment with military honors accorded by the Wyoming Army National Guard Honor Guard will be in the Wheatland Cemetery.

He died Sunday, June 20, 2010, at the Cheyenne Regional Medical Center in Cheyenne, Wyoming.

Terry was born August 15, 1950, in Torrington, Wyoming, the son of Herman Lee "Jack" and Betty M. (Bowman) Eddleman. The family lived briefly in Evanston and Guernsey, Wyoming before moving to Wheatland where Terry was reared and educated. He graduated from Wheatland High School in 1968 and then attended Casper College for two years. Terry joined the Wyoming Army National Guard on April 20, 1970 and retired July 4, 1992 with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. He worked for the Kansas-Nebraska Gas Company for several years before going to work full-time with his father in Jack's Electric as an electrical contractor. He married Linda S. Willis on August 7, 2009, in Loveland, Colorado. Terry was a member of International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers and Pheasants Forever. He enjoyed his grandchildren, hunting,

and spending time at the cabin. He was a problem solver and builder; and, was known to always have a project going.

Survivors include his wife, Linda of Wheatland; three children, Kemberly (Brandon) Graves of Wheatland, Chris (Toni) Eddleman of Fort Collins, Colorado, and Taryn Eddleman of Wheatland; a step-daughter, Denise (Joel) McDaniel of Wheatland; a sister, Cathy Sue (David) Evans of Wheatland; and six grandchildren: Kaitlyn Niemczyk, Beckett Graves, Trevin Graves, Brady Eddleman, Jhett McDaniel, and Jacey McDaniel.

He was preceded in death by his parents; a sister, Nancie Kay Cox on September 23, 2007; and a grandson, Casey Niemczyk on February 10, 1998.
