She leaves her husband; seven children, Betty Louise of Greeley, Colo., Lee James, with the U.S. army air corps at March field, Calif., and Thomas F., Frances Joann, Edwin R., Arden Gene and Allen A., all at home; four sisters, Mrs. David Lockman, Mrs. Henry Steeley, Mrs. George Borgans of Denver and Mrs. George Brunz of Estes Park, Colo. and one brother, George Mitchell of Saginaw, Mich.
