Final Rites Held December 4 For Scott C. Ingalls

Scott C. Ingalls, 61, prominent Wheatland real estate and insurance man, died at the William Irvine Memorial Home last Friday following ill health for the past three years.

Mr. Ingalls had resided in Wheatland since 1938 and prior to that had lived in Thermopolis. He was born January 1, 1895 in Pelican Rapids, Minn.

Final rites were conducted Tuesday at 2 p.m. at the Wheatland Episcopal church with Rev. Kale King officiating. The Masonic order conducted graveside services and burial was in the Wheatland cemetery. Uniformed members of the Commandery served as escorts.

Survivors include his wife, Viola; his mother, Mrs. B.F. Leonard of Moorhead, Minn., and a sister, Mrs. Billy Emerson, also of Moorhead.

Mr. Ingalls was a member of the Episcopal church; A.F. & A.M. No. 16 of Wheatland, Knights Templar, Royal Arch Masons and Korein Shrine; the Knights of Pythias, Odd Fellows, and was a past patron of the Order of the Eastern Star.

Pallbearers were Perry Brown, William I. Sutherland, Pat McGuire, Carl Preuit, Jay Cross and Ted Kruger.

Scott Ingalls, Prominent Real Estate Man, Dies

Scott Cleon Ingalls, who had been in ill health for the past three years, passed away, November 30, 1956, at the Wm. Irvine Memorial Home, following a heart attack.

He was born in Pelican Rapids, Minn., January 1, 1895 and was 61 years of age at the time of his death. Scott came to Wheatland in 1938 from Thermopolis and was in the Real Estate and Insurance business. He had been with the Pioneer Mutual Insurance Company for about 24 years.

Scott was affiliated and active in A.F. & A.M. 16, Knights Templar, Royal Arch, Korein Shrine, K. of P., I.O.O.F. and O.E.S. He was a member of the Episcopal church.
