

Glen Alan Irvine

WHEATLAND — Services for Glen Alan Irvine, 51, will be conducted at 9 a.m. Wednesday at the Irvine Ranch, 700 Richeau Rd., by Pastor Delbert Dick of the American Missionary Fellowship. Burial will be at the Wheatland Cemetery.

Mr. Irvine died July 30, 1994, at his ranch home. He was born March 7, 1943, at Wheatland, the son of James E. and Ruth M. (Chase) Irvine. The family lived on a ranch at Sybille Creek and then moved to the ranch at Antelope Creek in 1945.

He attended the Richeau School through the eighth grade and then attended and graduated from Wheatland High School. In 1967, he graduated from the University of Wyoming with a bachelor's degree in animal science.

In 1965, he married Mary Sumnick of Elkhorn, Neb. The couple ranched at the Chase ranch (his grandfather's ranch) at Richeau Creek in 1967.

In 1979, Mr. Irvine lost an arm in a ranch accident. He overcame

the handicap and continued to ranch. His three children, Duncan, Jason and Amanda, now operate the ranch.

Mr. Irvine was active in Laramie Peak Stock Growers and served as president from 1977 to 1979. He was recipient of the Outstanding Cooperator Award from Platte County Resource District.

His hobbies included watching the sports and activities of his children, grandchildren and others.

Survivors include his wife; his three children; his parents, Jim and Ruth Irvine of Wheatland; a sister, Sharon Longwood of Lemmon, S.D.; two grandchildren; and three nieces.
