

KENDIG, ANDREW L.

September 16, 1892-November 22, 1986

Andrew L. Kendig, former President and Chairman of the Board of First National Bank in Wheatland, now Norwest Bank Wheatland, now retired, died suddenly at Platte Co. Memorial Hospital in Wheatland, Nov. 22, 1986, after a brief illness.

Services were held at 2 p.m. Nov. 25 in the United Methodist Church with Father Kale King and Rev. Virgil Lamm officiating.

Mr. Kendig was preceded death by his wife, Bess H. Kendig, in March of 1973. He is the father of A. Edward Kendig, President of Norwest Bank Wheatland.

Mr and Mrs. Kendig were married in Denver, colo., in 1920 and made their home in Wheatland since 1938.

Mr. Kendig was born in Winona, Missouri, Sept. 16, 1892, and was graduated from the University of Missouri in 1916. He was a 2nd Lieutenant with the army in World War I. Later, he was an incorporator and first manager of the Farmers State Bank of Burns, where he was associated with that bank from 1919 to 1933. Thereafter he was manager of the Regional Agricultural Credit corporation, Cheyenne, 1933-1937.

He was with the First National Bank in Wheatland (formerly State Bank of Wheatland) from 1938 and served as chairman of the Board until two years ago. He was a past president of the Wyoming Bankers Association, a member of the Wheatland Lions Club and the American Legion, a 32nd Degree member and one of the founders of the Burns Masonic Lodge, and a member of the Korein Temple of the Shrine.

Survivors include his son and daughter-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. A. Edward Kendig of Wheatland; a brother-in-law, Clyde Snider of St. Louis, Missouri; and sisters-in-law Mrs. Howard Kendig of Sikeston, Missouri, and Mrs. Clint Davis of Indiatlantic, Fla.

Memorial contributions in his name may be made to the Platte Co. Hospital, the United Methodist church or All Saints Episcopal Church.

Burial was in the Wheatland Cemetery.
