

Sandra Outsen Kendig

A service for Christian burial for Sandra Outsen Kendig, 50 will be held Friday, Dec. 31, 1993, at 10 a.m. at the Wheatland United Methodist Church, with the Rev. Karin E. Wade of All Saints' Episcopal Church officiating, and assisted by the Rev. Dr. James S. Vuocolo of the United Church of Christ, Pastor Mark Patzke of the Covenant Lutheran Church and Rev. Linda Barnes of the Wheatland United Methodist Church.

Interment will follow in the Wheatland Cemetery.

Mrs. Kendig died Tuesday, Dec. 28, 1993 at her home in Wheatland.

She was born March 21, 1943, in Denton, Tex., the daughter of Robert and Berniece (Redshaw) Outsen. She attended school in Wurzburg, Germany, and Tokyo, Japan, where her father served in the military. The family returned to the United States in 1958, and Sandy graduated from Laramie High School in 1961.

Upon graduation from the Pasadena Playhouse College of Theatre Arts in 1963, Sandy became a member of the production staff at Stage Society Theatre in Los Angeles, where she later was general manager for eight years.

She moved to Cheyenne in 1973 and worked for Blue Cross-Blue Shield. She served as a member on the board of directors for the Cheyenne Little Theatre. On Aug. 28, 1976, she married A. Edward Kendig in Cheyenne, Wyo.

They made their home in Wheatland until the time of her death. Sandy was a director for First State Bank in Wheatland, was the founder and an active member of the Platte County Players, President of the P.E.O.-Chapter AW, served on the Library Board, was a member of All Saints' Episcopal Church where she was president of the Women's Guild, and Lay Leader of the church.

She is survived by her husband, Edward, of Wheatland, two sisters, Billie Jane Durham and Sharon Henney, both of Cheyenne, three nephews and five nieces. She is also survived by four of her husband's cousins.



Bank director dies of natural causes

WHEATLAND — Sandra Kendig, a 50-year-old Wheatland business woman, died Tuesday at her home of natural causes an autopsy revealed, a Wheatland Police Department spokesman said.

Kendig, who was a director of the First State Bank in Wheatland and active in a variety of civic organizations, died after falling in the shower, but the autopsy released Wednesday revealed death was caused by a rare heart disorder, the spokesman said.

She had been ill with the flu for several days, which might have contributed to the death.
