Long Time Resident Dies Here Mon., Burial To Be Dec. 8

Funeral services for Godfrey Kuehner, 81, will be held Friday, at 2 p.m. in the Christian church with Mr. C.E. Henry officiating.

Kuehner, born in South Webster, Ohio, June 26, 1869, died at the Wheatland General hospital December 4 after a week's stay. He had been a resident of Wheatland since 1900.

Before entering the grocery business from which he had been retired for some time, he had worked as a miner in Colorado and Montana for 13 years. He was a member of the Odd Fellows lodge for 55 years and had been presented with a 50-year medal from the organization. He was affiliated with the Christian church.

His wife Edna and five children survive him. They are Mrs. Mary Dunham, Mrs. Wilma Davis and Frank Kuehner, all of Wheatland, and Mrs. Rae Trabert, Twin Falls, Ida., and Roy Kuehner, Mountain City, Nev.

A brother, Ed Kuehner, South Webster, Ohio, and two sisters, Mrs. Margaret Dutiell and Mrs. Elizabeth Jackson of Portsmouth, Ohio, also survive. Frank Armann of Wheatland is the deceased's cousin. Ten grandchildren and two great-grandchildren also survive.

The Odd Fellows lodge will hold graveside services at the local cemetery. Pallbearers will be Harris Davis, John Johnson, Roger Mills, Ezra Davis, Charles Zohner and Chester Harter.

Death Comes To Godfrey Kuehner

Another honored and respected citizen of Wheatland this week passed to his great reward. Godfrey Henry Kuehner, 81, for fifty years a resident of Wheatland and for many years an active person in the growth of our little city a mere handful of buildings to one of the best towns of its size in the State of Wyoming. And in the growth Mr. Kuehner gained real enjoyment.

Mr. Kuehner was born in South Webster, Ohio, June 26, 1869, following the close of the Civil War, and died here Monday, December 4 at the Wheatland General hospital after a week's confinement.

Prior to his coming to Wheatland he had resided for a short time in Colorado and Montana. For more than fifty-five years he had been a member of the I.O.O.F. lodge, in which he had been an active, loyal member and officer. A few years ago, when his health began to fail him, he retired from the grocery business.

Surviving him is his wife, Edna, and four children, Mary Dunham, Wilma Davis, Frank Kuehner, all of Wheatland, and Roy Kuehner of Mountain City, Nevada, and Mrs. Ray Trabert of Twin Falls, Idaho. Also one brother, and one sister of South Webster, Ohio, Edward Kuehner, and Mrs. Elizabeth Dutiell of Portsmouth, Ohio. He also has ten grandchildren, and two great grandchildren. A cousin, Frank Armann, also of Wheatland survives.

Services will be held today (Friday) at two p.m. at the First Christian Church, with Rev. C.E. Henry officiating. The I.O.O.F. will conduct graveside services in the Wheatland cemetery.
