Joseph H. Lack Dies in Veterans Hospital In Cheyenne Tuesday

Joseph H. Lack, 51, of Guernsey, resident of this county since 1915, passed away in the Veterans hospital in Cheyenne at 9:15 p.m. Tuesday, April 17 following a two-week stay.

Funeral services will be held Saturday in the Methodist church in Wheatland with the Rev. W.W. Maxwell officiating. Interment will be in the Wheatland cemetery, and the local American Legion will have charge of the military graveside services.

Mr. Lack was born in Chariton, Ia., on January 8, 1892 and has been employed by the U.S. Reclamation service in Guernsey for the past few years. He is a member of the Wheatland Odd Fellows lodge, V.F.W., American Legion, and the A.O.U.W.

Besides his wife, Alice he is survived by one son, Cletis at home; four daughters, Mrs. Josephine Blummer of Wendover, Marilyn of Cheyenne and Katherine and Mildred at home; one brother, David Lack of Ft. Laramie; two sisters, Mrs. Eora Davenspike of Ft. Laramie and Mrs. Emma Loomis of Basin; and two grandchildren.

The body will lie in state at the Schrader Funeral home until time for the services Saturday.

Joseph H. Lack of Guernsey passed away at the Veterans hospital in Cheyenne Tuesday morning at the age of 51 years.

Mr. Lack was born at Chariton, Iowa and is a veteran of World War One, having left with the first division from Wheatland. He was employed by the U.S.R. Service in Guernsey, where he has lived since 1915.

He is survived by his wife, Alice, and four daughters, Josephine Blumer of Wendover, Marilyn Lack of Cheyenne, Cletis Katherine and Mildred at home; one brother, Dave at Ft. Laramie and two sisters, Zora Dovenspike of Ft. Laramie and Emma Loomis of Basin.

He was a member of the I.O.O.F., Veterans and A.O.U.W. organizations.

Funeral services will be held Saturday at the Methodist church with Rev. Maxwell officiating. Burial in the Wheatland cemetery with the American Legion in charge at the grave.
