Everett Linton Dies Sunday Of Gunshot Wound

Everett Charles Linton passed away at the Platte County Memorial hospital Sunday about three hours after suffering a self-inflicted gunshot wound. After investigation of the death by Coroner Ted S. Schrader, County Atty. Wm. R. Jones, and Sheriff W.I. Sutherland it was decided that no inquest be held.

The son of Harry G. and Hattie Petty Linton, he was born on February 22, 1921 in Wheatland and was a lifetime resident. He was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, having served during World War II. His occupation was that of a bartender and he had been employed at the LaRamie Bar for twelve years.

Funeral services were held from the Schrader chapel at 2 p.m. Wednesday with Rev. Vern M. Kruse the officiating minister and burial in the Wheatland cemetery. Pallbearers were Frank Soward, Andy Robinson, William Rider, James Perdue, Mel Dietrich and Reuben Good.

He is survived by his wife, Lila; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Harry G. Linton; two brothers, Master Sgt. Billy Linton, Rantoul, Ill. and Airman 1/c Raymond Linton, Lowry Air Base; one sister, Mrs. Cora Bowman of Casper and several uncles and aunts. One brother, George preceded him in death at Pearl Harbor.

Last Rites Held For E.C. Linton, Wed.

Last rites were conducted for Everett Charles Linton, 38, from the Schrader Chapel, Wednesday April 8, 1959, at 2:00 p.m. with Rev. Vern M. Kruse officiating.

Mr. Linton was born in Wheatland, February 22, 1921 and died April 5, 1959 in the Platte County Memorial Hospital, three hours following a self-inflicted gunshot wound. He was a bartender by occupation and had been employed at the LaRamie Bar for 12 years. He was a veteran of World War II and was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

His death was investigated by Coroner Ted S. Schrader, County Attorney Wm. R. Jones and Sheriff Wm. I. Sutherland and there will be no inquest into the death.

He is survived by his wife, Lila of Wheatland; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Harry G. Linton of Wheatland; two brothers, M/Sgt. Billy Linton, Rantoul, Ill., and Airman 1/c Raymond Linton, Lowry Air Base, Denver, Colo.; one sister, Mrs. Cora Bowman of Casper and several aunts and uncles. One brother preceded him in death at Pearl Harbor.

Interment was in the Wheatland cemetery with pallbearers being Frank Soward, Andy Robinson, Wm. Rider, James Purdue, Mel Dietrich and Reuben Good.
