**Harry Qualls Sr. dies at home in Lingle Apr. 15**

An extended illness claimed the life of Harry Qualls, Sr. at his home in Lingle on April 15, 1966. He was born in DuBois, Ill. on March 9, 1887, and was married to Viola MacKenzie on August 19, 1907 in St. Louis, Mo. The couple resided in Wheatland from 1926 until 1961 when they moved to Lingle. Mr. Qualls was employed as an electrician until his retirement, and was a member of the Methodist church.

Last rites were conducted by Rev. Henry Hartberg and Dr. David Stewart at the Methodist church in Wheatland on April 18 at 2:00 p.m. with interment in the Wheatland cemetery.
