Funeral Services For C.E. Sadler Held Yesterday

Curtis E. Sadler, who passed away in Wheatland on July 19, had been a resident here for almost twenty-five years. He was born at Delmar, Iowa on October 7, 1867, being 67 years, 9 months and 7 days of age at the time of his demise. He was the son of Robert Lee and Charlotte Sadler.

Mr. Sadler lived in Iowa until 1906, when he moved to Ansley, Nebr. where he lived until 1913, at which time he moved to Wheatland where he has since made his home.

In 1904 he was united in marriage to Mrs. Callie Sadler, who was his brother's widow. To this union one son was born, Glenn Elmer Sadler, who preceded his father in death about eight years. Mr. Sadler was one of a family of fourteen children, with only four surviving members.

Surviving relatives are his wife, Mrs. Callie Sadler, one stepson, Lloyd C. Sadler, one stepdaughter, Mrs. Claude Norris and four granddaughters, Mrs. Albert Kruer, Ora Leta and Phyllis Norris and three grandsons, Leo Norris, Dean and Keith Sadler and one great-granddaughter, Jean Kruer, two brothers Bert and Frank Sadler of Ansley, Nebr., and Mrs. Seth Duncan of Stratton, Colo. and Willard Sadler of Oklahoma City.

He was united with the Evangelical church in 1908, of which he has always remained a member.

Rev. Lasher officiated at the funeral services, which were held on Wednesday afternoon at the Watson & Dennis Home for Funerals, and interment was made at the Wheatland cemetery.

Another Old-Timer Called by Death

Curtis Elmer Sadler was born at Delmar, Clinton county Iowa. October 7, 1867 and departed this life in Wheatland, Monday, July 19, 1937, being 67 years, nine months and seven days old. He was the son of Robert Lee and Charlett Sadler and lived in Iowa until 1906 when he moved west and settled in Ainsley, Nebraska, until 1913 when he moved to Wheatland where his home had since been made. In 1904 he was united in marriage to Callie Sadler, his brother's widow, and to them was born one son, Glenn Elmer, who preceded him in death eight years ago. Mr. Sadler was one of a family of 14 children of whom only four survive him.

He leaves to mourn his death, his wife, Callie; one stepson, Lloyd Sadler; one stepdaughter, Mrs. Claud Norris, and four granddaughters, Mrs. Albert Kreuer; Ora, Leta and Phyllis Norris; three grandsons, Leo Norris and Dean and Keith Sadler and one little great-granddaughter, Glenda Jane Kruer. He also leaves three brothers and one sister: Bert and Frank Sadler of Ainsley, Nebraska; Willard Sadler of Oklahoma City and Mrs. Seth Duncan of Stratton, Colo., and a host of friends.
