**Frank Valentine Of Guernsey Dies At Local Hospital**

A retired Guernsey farmer expired Wednesday, March 30 at a local hospital after a lengthy illness. He was Frank O. Valentine, a native of New Jersey who had resided at Guernsey for the past fifteen years. He was born March 4, 1867 and died at the age of 88 years.

A brother, Roy Valentine, Wichita, Kans. and a sister, Mrs. Alpha Deming of Oklahoma and several nieces and nephews survive.

Final rites were held at Schrader chapel Saturday morning with Rev. C.E. Tilford of Guernsey officiating. Burial was at the Wheatland cemetery.

**Last Rites Held For Frank O. Valentine**

Frank O. Valentine, retired farmer, oldest son of Martin and Fannie Valentine, was born March 4, 1867 at Cambridge, Ill., and departed this life March 30, 1955, at 6:00 p.m., in the Wheatland hospital, at the age of 88 years and 26 days.

When he was around 12 years old he moved, with his parents, five brothers and one sister, to Peabody Kans., where he grew to manhood. He never married.

He moved to Wyoming where he joined his brothers who were engaged in farming near Lone Tree Canyon. Upon his retirement he moved to Dwyer, making his home with his sister, Mrs. Jim Deming. Later, he and his brother, Al, built a house in Guernsey where they lived for 15 years. They spent many happy hours caring for their flower and vegetable gardens.

In 1953, Mr. Valentine's health failed and he moved to Wheatland. He had been in the Wheatland hospital most of that time.

His parents and five brothers preceded him in death and he is survived by one sister, Mrs. Aljha Deming of Isabella, Okla., and one brother, Roy Valentine of Wichita, Kans., numerous nephews and nieces and a host of friends.

Schrader Funeral Home was in charge of the service in the Chapel, at 10:30 a.m., Saturday, April 2, 1955, with Rev. C.E. Tilford of Guernsey officiating.

Burial was made in the Wheatland cemetery.
