**Henry Valentine Dwyer Resident Dies Wednesday**

Henry Valentine, 65, died here Wednesday from injuries suffered this week in an accident at his farm home.

Mr. Valentine was born at Cambridge, Illinois and had lived at Dwyer for about seven years. He is survived by five brothers, William and Roy of Chugwater, Frank of Dwyer, Albert and Robert of Guernsey and one sister, Mrs. J.A. Deming of Dwyer.

**ACCIDENT CAUSES DEATH OF DWYER FARMER**

Henry Valentine, 65, single, of Dwyer died in the Wheatland hospital Wednesday of injuries received on his farm.

Valentine was driving his team hitched to a rubber tired wagon for a load of wood. The horses came to a small ditch at the bottom of a hill. As they jumped he was thrown from the wagon which rolled on him. He suffered a broken leg, internal injuries and severe shock.

He was found by a neighbor about six hours later and taken to the hospital, arriving too late for any help.

He was born March 24, 1873 in Cambridge, Illinois.

Funeral services will be held from the Watson and Dennis chapel at 2:30 Sun. afternoon. Burial will be made in the Wheatland cemetery.
