

VANLEUVEN, LEE FRANKLIN
August 15, 1888-June 20, 1976

Former area resident, Lee Franklin VanLeuven, succumbed to an extended illness in Memorial Hospital in Cheyenne, Sunday, June 20, 1976. He was 87 years old. Funeral services are to be held Wednesday, June 23, 1976, at the Schrader-Prell Chapel at 2:00 p.m. Rev. Loren C. Irish will conduct the services. Interment will be at the Wheatland Cemetery.

Art E. Smith, Irvin Flatum, Jacob Goertz, Edward Kendig, Sterling Bostwick and Boyd Ash will serve as pallbearers. Schrader-Prell Funeral Home is charge of arrangements.

Mr. VanLeuven was born in Tarko, Missouri August 15, 1888. He homesteaded on the Slater Flats in 1911 and married Zolo Haney in Chugwater, March 18, 1914. A wheat farmer, Mr. VanLeuven retired to Cheyenne in 1955.

Mr. VanLeuven was of the Protestant faith and a member of the Masons in Chugwater. He was a Past Master of the Masons in Chugwater and City Councilman in 1932 in Chapel, Nebraska where he owned an implement and hardware business for a time.

In death he is survived by his wife, Zolo of Cheyenne; two grandchildren, Jerald VanLeuven and Sandra Stokes of Cheyenne; and five great grandchildren, all of Cheyenne. A son, Judd Edmund VanLeuven, preceded him in death in January, 1945. A brother, Richard VanLeuven and a sister, Linnie Taylor, also preceded him in death.
