MRS. KOONS YARBOROUGH DIES AT AMARILLO, TEXAS

Mrs. Frances Edith Yarbrough, aged 22 years, well known in Wheatland as Frances Koons, passed away Feb. 28th, at her home in Amarillo, Texas, from acute dilation of the heart, following an attack of influenza. Mrs. Yarbrough attended high school here three years ago, leaving when her parents moved to Laramie to place their children in the schools of that place. Previous to that time she had passed almost the whole of her life on the Koons ranch in the hills 30 miles west of Wheatland. She had many friends and acquaintances here. The body arrived here Tuesday evening accompanied by the parents, Mr. and Mrs. John E. Koons, and was met at this place by the two brothers, Dillon and Dan Koons, who have been operating the ranch west of town. The funeral will be held from the Christian church.

FRANCIS EDITH KOONS YARBROUGH

The community was saddened to hear of the death of Mrs. B. Yarbrough, whose maiden name was Francis Koons, who died at the home of Mr. Yarbrough's parents at Armorilla, Texas, Feb. 28th, 1920, after a six week illness of influenza. The remains were brought to Wheatland and funeral services were conducted by Mrs. Wales at the Christian church Wednesday afternoon at 3 o'clock.

Francis Edith Koons was born near Billings, Okla. Feb. 17, 1898. She was united in marriage to B. Yarbrough, Feb. 28, 1919. Besides her husband, she leaves to mourn her death a father and mother, Four sisters, Dorothy, Iola (?), Margaret, and Jessie, also two brothers, Dillon and Don, one brother having preceded her in death by whom she was laid to rest in the Wheatland Cemetery.
