Mrs. Anna Yates Yields To Death After Long Illness

Death claimed another beloved pioneer in the sunset hours of Tuesday afternoon when the spirit of Mrs. Anna V. Yates departed. Born in Germany, December 24th, 1858, she came to Wyoming when quite young. She was married to Edward M. Yates, May 7th, 1882, in Cheyenne. Mr. Yates was a native of Texas, where he served with the famous Texas Rangers. He was prominently a cattle man and the Yates home was noted for its open handed hospitality far and near. Mr. Yates died in Denver in August of 1926 and is buried here. Mrs. Yates has been in failing health for some time and all that love and skill could do has been done to save her life but to no avail.

One child was bitten by a rattlesnake and died quite young. Surviving are A. Lynn of Eugene, Ore., John of Los Angeles, W.B. of Tulsa, Okla., R.G. of Uva, Mrs. Martha Hickson, Cedar Edge, Colo., Mrs. J.E. Criff, Miss Anne V. of Uva, two nieces in Leavenworth, Kan., and eleven grandchildren. Mrs. Yates was of the type of women who make a home that remains a benediction in the lives of their children forever, a friend that never failed under trail, a wife whose counsel was a boon and a neighbor to every passer by in kindness and aid.

Funeral services will be held this (Thursday) afternoon at 2 o'clock in the Lyla Watson Funeral Home parlors with Rev. Ward, of Torrington, officiating and burial made beside her husband in the Wheatland cemetery.

Mrs. Anna V. Yates, 75 year old Uva matron, passed away Tuesday, May 15th, after an illness of long duration.

Funeral services are being held this afternoon from the Lyla Watson Funeral Home with W. Hewton Ward, rector of the Episcopal church, in charge of the services. Interment will be made in the Wheatland cemetery.

Mrs. Yates was born in Germany, December 24, 1858. She was married in Cheyenne, May 17, 1882. Her husband Edw. N. Yates, passed away in 1926.

Mrs. Yates came to the Uva community 53 years ago and helped in building this part of the county. She was well known and respected throughout the entire county.

She is survived by five sons: Edward, A.L. of Eugene, Ore., John of Los Angeles, W.B. of Tulsa, Okla., and R.G. of Uva; three daughters, Mrs. Martha Hickman, Cederedge, Colo., Mrs. Jack Criss of Uva and Anna Yates of Uva, Wyo. She is also survived by 11 grandchildren and two nieces.
